

Hellrigg Community Benefit Fund

A fund for charitable activities for local communities located close to the Hellrigg Wind Farm

Funded by RWE Npower Renewables Ltd.

How much is available?

£15,000 available each year

Who can apply?

A voluntary or community group or a local partnership which benefit Silloth or the parishes of Home St Cuthberts, Holme Low and Holme Abbey

What can be funded?

Charitable, community activities that are:

- **Environmental or**
- **Community related or**
- **Educational related.**

Examples of activities the fund would like to support:

- Environmental sustainability improvements to community facilities
- Projects to improve the energy efficiency of residents on low incomes
- Projects identified as needed by the local communities in the North Copeland Partnership Plan.

If you are interested in applying to this fund, please read the following details carefully:

We **will not** fund activities that:

- relate to the advancement of religion
- relate to the advancement of any party political activity
- are anti-renewable energy.

How much can you apply for?

The minimum grant will be £500.

In exceptional circumstances a single grant of £10,000 may be awarded in a year and multi-year applications will also be considered.

It is proposed that funding is awarded equitably across the four communities over 3 years.

To ensure the fund meets community needs, Cumbria Community Foundation will meet once a year with representatives from the Parish. All applications must receive the support from this advisory panel.
